

Daily Forklift Inspection Checklist

1- Pre-Start Inspection

□ Inspect the overall condition of the forklift, including the tires, forks, mast, and body.

Check the fluid levels, including fuel, oil, and coolant (if applicable), and top off if necessary.

Check the battery charge level (if applicable), ensuring it is fully charged.

□ Inspect for any signs of damage or leaks, such as hydraulic leaks or oil spills.

□ Check the seat belt and horn, ensuring they are functioning properly.

2- Propane Forklift Inspection

4- Start-Up Inspection

- □ Start the forklift and listen for any unusual noises, such as grinding or knocking sounds.
- □ Check the gauges and warning lights to ensure they are functioning properly.
- Test the brakes and parking brake to ensure they are working correctly.
- Test the steering, ensuring it is responsive and not too loose or too tight.
- Test the horn and lights, ensuring they are working properly.

5- Operational Inspection

- Test the lift and tilt mechanisms to ensure they are working correctly.
- Test the hydraulic system, checking for any signs of leaks or malfunctions.
- Test the emergency stop button, ensuring it stops the forklift immediately.
- Test the forward and reverse gears, ensuring they are engaging properly.
- Test the speed control, ensuring it is working correctly and not stuck.

- □ Park the forklift and turn off the engine.
- ☐ Inspect the forklift for any damage or leaks, noting any defects or malfunctions.
- Lower the forks to the ground and disengage the controls.
- Engage the parking brake and remove the key.
- Report any defects or malfunctions to the supervisor or maintenance department immediately.
